


Let us continue to work together as a community, lifting each other up and striving for excellence in all that we do. I am excited to see the amazing things you will accomplish in the days ahead.




# BALANCING A BALL ON A ZIGZAG LINE:

For example, they might see a pattern like red-blue-red-blue and be asked to choose the next color.**




# **SORTING NUMBERS**




# VISIT TO SUPERMARKET:-




# Traffic awareness program



